HERMANN MAIFEST Sunday May 22

The Maifest is set for the weekend of May 21st & 22nd, but a train trip from Jeff City on Sunday the 22nd is more of the quieter part of the weekend, instead of dealing with the Saturday crowds. Get with AmTrak BY PHONE at 800-872-7245 to procure a ticket in advance on the River Runner (Jeff City has no attendant on duty - just ask Bonnie). AND you must do this by 24 hours in advance due to having to complete a 4-question form verbally about Covid 19.

The Runner departs the JC station at 11:25 and is only a 46 min travel time to Hermann, for a \$19 one-way ticket for an adult. Senior price must be a bit lower. NOTE that NON-user friendly AmTrak website is a pain to both get to and go thru, so get a ticket thru the phone by Noon Saturday!

Leaving a phone message will get an agent to respond back to you – I guarantee it. Just remember: it's impossible to get a ticket on the same day Sunday.

It'll be the free trolley time, once we get there, from Aaron @ <u>636-575-6920</u> and he'll get us to where ever we wish. Just tip him. Won't even need to stay in a group to get to any of the area wineries.

NIANGUA RIVER FLOAT M-T June 27 & 28

After a 3-year hiatus, it's back on for a two-day Mon & Tues float of the Niangua River. This is a 2-day float trip in conjunction with the Topeka Ski Club, starting with a Sunday evening campout (June 26). The standard 2 day float comes out of Bennett Springs State Park on Monday morning, and we'll float back to our usual campsites at Maggard's Corkery Campground. The current plan is for primitive camping in a group setting on Sunday and Monday nights, and electric hook-ups are available. June 27 & 28 are the planned floating dates, with a bus ride back to the camp site on the 2nd day, a Tuesday, and usually by 2pm or so. Camping is available at the State Park or make arrangements at the area's Sand Spring Motel, or the State Park even has cabins available.
